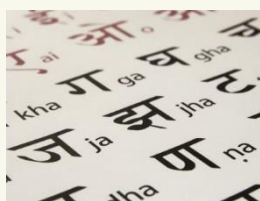

Ralle Balle proudly presents: **Matrabhasha mera Parichay** a theatre piece specifically designed for the World Hindi Day celebrations at the Indian Embassy in Berlin. The focus of the play is on the language – its beauty and its strengths for a Indian Father and his son, as well as its healing powers to make the son reconnect with his heritage and become a transponder between his Hindi roots and the new culture he lives in.

Ralle Balle is a collective of artists of various disciplines that realizes theatre productions and artistic experiments such as live acts, performances, and radio plays since 20014 to make interventions in everyday life, as much as stimulate utopic thinking. The first production „Frauenknast - Diese ganze lange Nacht“ was elected for the Premium Price for Newcomers in Switzerland. In 2016 Ralle Balle realized its first Hindi-German Theatre Live-Radioplay „Praivet Laif“ from the Hindi author Gitanjali Shree.

Charlotte Alten – Director and Producer of the play, is an actress and director (Master of Arts in Theater, Zürcher Hochschule der Künste 2010) who lived and worked in London, Switzerland and Germany. She was invited to the International Children and Youth Theatre Festival „Schöne Aussicht“ in Stuttgart with the world premiere of the play „Ramayana“ by Karen Köhler.

Kenneth George is an actor, director and writer who has won awards for his screenplays in India and his theatre work spanning India, Japan, the USA, and most of Europe. Since 1999, he lives and works in Germany.

Chankya Bhardwaj is a software engineer in Berlin, but worked in Bangalore as a theatre actor and writer before coming here. He had his own theatre company there, and has written plays in Hindi for the company, as well as translated European playwrights into Hindi.
